You can create your own template for illusion, or shadow, knitting. This fun technique allows you to make two unique designs that are each visible from different angles. The effect uses two contrasting yarns. Colors and stitches alternate so that raised stitches (formed by purling) obscure flat stitches (formed by knitting) when they are seen directly. Each line considered in the illusion is actually formed by four rows, two background colors and two front. A tightly swirling yarn is best suited to the illusion of knitting because it keeps the stitches crispy. Homespun or novelty yarn can block the effect. Put the graph paper on a flat surface. Use the paper graph to create a template for your knitting illusion. Each square will represent one stitch, and each row is equivalent to knitting a string (although in the illusion of knitting, each row actually worked 4 times). Create a template on graph paper. For the first project of the illusion of knitting, keep the pattern as simple as a heart or a star. Fill boxes with a handle to distinguish your design. Count the number of boxes filled at the widest point of the template. You will need to throw on at least this many stitches when you start knitting. Start with the bottom row of the filled graph paper when you throw in. You will follow your model from the bottom up. Tips to tie your pattern: Use a single color yarn, knit through a row once and then knit through again until you reach the first stitch on the needle that is filled with paper graphics. Purl any stitches that are filled, and knit stitches that are white. Knit across the row in the second color of the yarn. Then you will purl through the next row until you reach the first stitch on the needle, which is filled with paper graphics. Tie any stitches that are filled and purl stitches that are white. Those of you who are new to the illusion of knitting can appreciate the explanation of the basics and a very simple worked example. Illusion knitting is created in ridges, each ridge is only one color of yarn. Illusion jerseys are usually created with two contrasting colors of yarn, but sometimes they can only be found in one color. When viewed from the front, only these alternating crests of color will be visible, but when viewed from the appropriate angle, you will see the image. In the illusion of knitting each right side row - it's knitted stitches. On the wrong side row the stitch will either knit or purl. Purl stitches on the wrong side row will create a slight drop in work if in front, knitting stitches will not have this effect. It is this difference knit and purl stitches that are used to create the effects we see in the illusion of knitting. Pieces of the illusion of knitting are designed to be viewed from the side or below. When the completed illusion is dealt from the appropriate place any dips created by the purl stitches on the wrong side rows will allow the knitted stitches in the ridge behind them to stand out and be seen. The general idea in creating the illusion of knitting designs is to decide which stitches you want to see, knitting these stitches on the wrong side of the work and purling stitches in the ridge directly in front of them on the wrong side of the job. With this type of knitting an equal number of stitches, casts and knitted ridges will be very close to being square (if you work with a very large piece). This means that if the square chart I use to create my illusion of knitting shows ridges knitting instead of rows of knitting will not distort the original image I use. Taking a very simple example. I want to create the illusion of a knit that shows the square on the corner. Using a computer drawing program, I'll put a grid over the image. I need to scale the image so I can get enough detail into it. Remember that each square on the grid is a stitch. If you don't have a computer drawing program that will allow you to do this, then Inkscape is free to download and relatively easy to use. You'll find an explanation of how to create the grids that you need using Inkscape as one of the pages at the top of the shadow and illusion knitting homepage. I'm going to use two colors to tie my illusion. It will be contrasting colors. The dark grey that I use for color in squares represents one of these colors and light gray represents another color. These colors will show stitches that are knitted on the wrong side row (remember that all the stitches on the right side of the rows will knit stitches). The seams that need to be purlled on the wrong side row will have their squares on the grid left white. Starting at the bottom corner of the red square. I want to see the corner stitch, so I paint it with a dark gray rectangle. It will be a knitted stitch in my dark color. The seams on either side of this stitch should be hidden, they should be purl stitches, so I leave them white. The stitch right under this dark stitch should be purlled (so it will allow you to see the dark stitch behind), so I leave this square on the white mesh. The seams on either side of this purl stitch should be knitted, so I color them with light gray. Completing the coloring of the rest of the grid gives this. When the illusion of knitting is completed the central square appears to be one of my two colors of yarn and surround what appears to be a different color of yarn. Before I print the grid, or try to view it to make my knitting illusion, I would hide the layer showing image. The next grid coloring change will make the central square square completed the illusion, it seems one of my two colors and surround seems to be a mixture of my two colors.
